






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A Message from Mark





Financials

During the 2021-2022 school year, MRCS maintained in-person and virtual classrooms for students. We saw an increase in Federal Funds due to the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER II). These one-time funds went largely towards facility improvements that helped facilitate a safe return to school for students. ESSER funds were also utilized for technology upgrades that enable all students to participate remotely if needed.





Mental Health

To support mental health and improve social emotional learning, Montessori Regional Charter School has hired a full time Mental Health Therapist. MRCS continues to develop programming and policies for the betterment of students' overall well-being.

- Social Emotional wellness has direct linkage to academic success as students need to feel safe, supported, and emotionally regulated to fulfill their highest academic abilities.
- MRCS will begin universal Social Emotional Learning lessons in each classroom with lessons informed by the CASEL Framework 5 Core Competence Areas: Self Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness, Relationship Skills and Responsible Decision Making.

Beginning this current school year, the mental health therapist will support students with managing anxiety by better understanding anxiety, developing coping strategies and facing anxiety to build confidence in their capabilities.

Increasing resources while decreasing barriers to academic success is on the MRCS agenda for improving mental health and well-being. The SAP (Student Assistance Program) is a project in motion at MRCS. This program aims to identify issues that create barriers to student success and help overcome these barriers using a team approach. With parent permission the SAP team can gather information of needs and develop a plan that may include in school strategies or connection to communitybased services and activities.

What is the MRCS Care Team?

The MRCS Care Team is a program for students who demonstrate a need for support in academics, attendance, and/or mental health counseling. The members of the MRCS Care Team are trained school staff who work alongside parents/guardians to discuss resources and establish a plan to maximize the student's success.

How is a student referred to the MRCS Care Team?

MRCS Teachers and Administrators get to know our students on a personal level and are often at the forefront of discovering their personal challenges- referrals may come from school staff. However, students may also be referred by parents/guardians, or by self or peer referral. If your child has a problem, it is important to remember they are not alone, help is available. Allow the MRCS Care Team to be a part of your child's support system. Making Connections

As part of the process, standardized assessments will be completed by the building administrator, teachers, nurse and other relevant persons. Parents are asked to complete a form and be a part of the process. Requested data will include information about a student's behavior, academic performance, health, and attendance. The MRCS Care Team can assist students by connecting them and their families with resources that meet their specific needs. These resources are available through the School Psychologist, Mental Health Therapist, and the Pyramid Drug & Alcohol Counselor. The MRCS Care Team can also recommend outside agencies for more intense needs. Administors, teachers and the school nurse are also available for support.

The MRCS Care Team is a voluntary program. Parent consent/permission is required. Please review consent forms sent home following a referral and return them within a timely manner. The process may not begin until parental consent is provided. Separate consent for Mental Health Services is required. Not every student referred to MRCS Care Team may need Mental Health Services therefore Mental Health consent forms will only be sent home if these services are indicated during the information gathering process.

Technology

MRCS utilized Chromebooks and Newline boards to enhance student engagement while following CDC recommendations for social distancing. This technology will continue to enrich student learning now and in the future.



A one-to-one program allows each enrolled student to utilize an assigned Chromebook to supplement traditional Montessori instruction with technology resources. The goal is to enhance classroom instruction and student achievement in the areas of problem solving, science, math, reading and writing.



Newline Interactive Touch Display

We have installed a Newline Interactive Touch Display in every classroom this summer. After a successful pilot program in the Spring 2022 we have implemented a standard classroom setup to include a height adjustable Interactive display and a large whiteboard.

Improvements that were made to the MRCS building and grounds in 2021 and 2022 as well as a look into what is to come.



Safety & Security

At the start of the school year, every student and staff member learns about MRCS's Standard Response Protocol. The Standard Response Protocol is a set of research based actions/ drills designed to prepare students, staff and parents for emergency situations. It was created by the I Love U Guys Foundation.







Safe2Say Something

Students and staff are trained every year about the Safe2Say Something system. This program teaches students and staff on how to recognize the warning signs and signals from individuals who may be a threat to themselves or others. They are encouraged to say something and report concerns to a hotline via phone call, website or by using the Safe2Say app. This program is run by the Pennsylvania Office of the Attorney General.

Hapara-Student Online Safety

Hapara is a program that our school utilizes to keep our students safe and focused while learning online. This program works with Google Workspace for Education, like Google Classroom, to support our students and teachers online by encouraging students to be responsible and become good digital citizens. Teachers are able to see student screens and tabs in real time to be sure that students are focused on the assignment or task. Hapara also features a filter that blocks student access to inappropriate sites, images and videos. Administrators are alerted of any activity on the Chromebook like website searches, images, or videos that may suggest self-harm. These features are another measure that we use to keep our students safe online.


